## A PLEA for PRAYER - December, 2014 - No. 143

We would appreciate updates on the location of our military because of continued unit movements.

Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends (John 15:13). Let us come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need (Hebrews 4:16). And the work of righteousness shall be peace; and the effect of righteousness quietness and assurance for ever (Isaiah 32:17).

The request continues. Please pray for our OPC men and women, sons and daughters who are in harm's way, about to be in harm's way, and who support those in harm's way. *The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much* (James 5:16b). *Pray without ceasing* (I Thessalonians 5:17).

A wise man will hear, and will increase learning; and a man of understanding shall attain unto wise counsels: The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy is understanding. (Proverbs 1:5; 9:10) Please also read 2 Timothy 1-14.

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Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; and ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free. (John 8:31-32).

**Prayer focus:** *Abide in My Word* - In chapter eight of the Gospel of John the Apostle records a remarkable incident in the earthly ministry of our LORD Jesus, specifically on the occasion in which Christ introduced the concept of dwelling (or abiding) in something other than a physical house or similar dwelling place (8:31-32). To a group of Jews who in some way apparently believed in him, He called them to "abide in my word," a simple, and yet profound invitation.

That raises the question as to what Christ meant, for the idea of somehow physically dwelling in Christ's words is not reasonable. That in turn drives us to regard His call as a metaphor or illustration, calling us spiritually to immerse ourselves regularly in Christ's (recorded) words. To us, that necessarily means reading them over and over, listening to them wherever and whenever that is possible, meditating on them, and over time memorizing many of them. Such immersion in our Redeemer's thoughts carries with it a most comforting result, namely that He then regards us as "true" disciples.

However, the estate of being a "true disciple" carries with it the clear implication that there are some, although they are called disciples, who are not in fact, genuine disciples. This implication carried a serious fulfillment soon after, in which we read (verse 44) Jesus' solemn declaration to them, "you are of your father the devil". Sobering.

Wherein then lies the difference? Christ states it well in verse 32, "you shall know the truth and the truth shall make you free." Sadly, His then present hearers reacted defensively, focusing on

their descent from Abraham and the absurd claim that they had never been enslaved to anyone! Not only were their forefathers enslaved to Egyptians, Philistines, Midianites, and Assyrians, to mention a few, but they were in bondage to Rome and so missed His point entirely. Christ was talking about freedom from enslavement to sin.

That glorious freedom from sin, and of course from the cruel power of sin, flows out of knowing "the truth," and that "truth" ultimately is Jesus Himself (verse 36, and John 14:6)! The written Word of God is supernatural and powerful, sharper than any two-edged sword, and instrumental not only in our salvation, but also in our sanctification (II Thessalonians 2:13). How much more then, is Jesus Himself effectual in making us free through the powerful instrumentality of His Holy Spirit when we engage in reading and hearing His own words. "If therefore the Son shall make you free, you shall be free in truth." May God be pleased to grant us continual thankfulness of heart that in Jesus we are delivered from being slaves of sin, in order to become slaves of righteousness for His glory (Romans 6:5-22).

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Please pray for our valiant men of war to call out to God continually for strength to enable victory over the enemy and that they will continue to be well equipped for battle. And please pray that our nation will be led by humble leaders who call on the name of the Lord and rule righteously that we might have peace. Please pray that God will *show himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward him.* Pray that they will fear only God and not man and be of a good courage. Pray that they will be bold as a lion and that the wicked will flee. (Prov. 28:1)

Pray as we battle forces both foreign and domestic in our long war; plead with our God to make a way of escape from defeat, from losing heart in the battle and that in doing so, God will restore us as a nation to His righteousness. Pray for the gracious and needed gift from God of genuine national repentance; especially from the iniquities of abortion, supporting homosexuality, the widespread disregard of the fourth commandment and rejection of the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Continue to pray that we will recognize the true nature of the enemy. Be not weary in hoping, praying and waiting to see the salvation of our great God whose new mercies come every morning! Pray that the Gospel may continue to have free expression. Pray that the culture of death will be defeated and that our nation will stand united and will endure in the defense of freedom. Please continue to pray for the spouses, children, parents and siblings of our warriors. Pray for the families of the fallen and for the wounded that they may all endure and come to rest and trust in Christ. May they defend our nation's liberties as guaranteed by our Constitution with stalwart hearts and minds!
