Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends (John 15:13). Let us come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need (Hebrews 4:16). And the work of righteousness shall be peace; and the effect of righteousness quietness and assurance for ever (Isaiah 32:17).

Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God, and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. - Philippians 4:6,7.

Prayer focus: *Anxiety* - Our text contains two commands (the first Negative... the second Positive) and one assured consequence.

- 1.) Nothing is more normal for "caring" people than the temptation to be anxious. When the outcome matters... especially if we or someone we care about has a vested interest in it... anxiety comes stalking. This passage, addressed to God's People, instructs us not, under any circumstances, to welcome "Anxiety" into our hearts... or be bullied by it, into doubting God.
- 2.) What we are to do is cast our care on the Lord by presenting our concerns to Him in prayer. We who are His have the privilege of expressing our burdens to our Father in Heaven through the effectual mediation of His Son our Commander and Chief Jesus. We can then rest, being well assured that the Judge of all the earth will do what is right and good.
- 3.) As this Spirit wrought confidence is experienced... our hearts and minds are enabled to be at peace... even in the midst of great uncertainty and unrest. Our inability to reasonably discribe how this works may cause doubt and provoke ridicule from those who have never experienced it... but we know Who we have believed in and we are more than persuaded that He is as Good as He is Great and as Merciful and He is Mighty! The promise of His Love is signed with the blood of His Son. Praise and Thanks be to God!

Fellow Saint, Deployed or At Home... "cast your **care*** upon Him, for He cares for you." – 1 Peter 5:7.

*(or "anxiety" - same original root as Phil.4:6)

Robert B. Needham Resolution

The 82nd General Assembly adopted the following Resolution of Appreciation for the Service to Christ and His Church by Commander Robert B. Needham, CHC, USN, Retired.

Robert B. Needham was licensed to preach the Gospel by the Orthodox Presbyterian Church in 1966, and ordained a Minister of the Gospel on 11 June, 1967, in the Reformed Presbyterian Church, Evangelical Synod. The great- and great-great-grandson of two Scottish clipper captains, he went to sea for a year and a half before he finished high school. He graduated from Reed College, Portland, Oregon, where he was introduced to the Gospel by the son of an OPC ruling elder, met his wife Barbara, and made profession of faith in the First OPC, Portland. After graduation from Westminster Theological Seminary, Philadelphia, PA, he served a mission church in Alabama and an additional pastorate in Pennsylvania, and then was commissioned in the Chaplain Corps of the United States Navy in 1968; called to active duty in 1971. He is a graduate of the Naval Postgraduate School. He returned to serve in the OPC while still on active duty in 1987. He served until his retirement in 1992, when his was "piped off" from his last duty station at the Naval Hospital, Camp Pendleton, CA. Then after serving as a Christian counselor in San Diego along with service as Assistant Pastor at Bayview OPC, he pastored a new congregation, New Hope OPC in Hanford, CA, from 1992 until his

retirement in December of 2012. Traveling extensively, he has served numerous sessions as pulpit supply and as an adjunct member of their sessions.

Chaplain Needham was first elected a member of the RPCES Committee on Chaplains in 1976. In 1978, the RPCES, the PCA and the OPC formed the Presbyterian and Reformed Commission on Chaplains and Military Personnel. When the OPC first formed its own Chaplain Committee in 1998, Chaplain Needham was one of the three original members, serving all but one year to date. He has served as Chairman of the CCMP, and for several years as Vice Chairman of the Commission and on many of its committees.

We believe there are few if any who have contributed more succinct, biblical guidance material with a clear military understanding for chaplains and their commanders than Chaplain Needham. At the same time it has provided useful material protective of our various chaplain corps personnel not only within the Reformed community, but also has been used by other church commissions. Chaplain Needham continues to serve as a police chaplain with King's County Sheriff's Department, California.

We thank God at every remembrance of his service and give all glory and praise for his service to the Lord Jesus Christ, King of Kings and Lord of Lords, our nation's various Chaplain Corps, and to the church of Christ for his faithful service. His gracious, wise, gentle and humble leadership will be sorely missed by the Orthodox Presbyterian Church Committee on Chaplains and Military Personnel.

- The revision of DADT presents difficulties for many Christians, both those serving in line positions and those serving as chaplains. Therefore we urge you to pray:
- 1. For all who serve in our military who name the name of Christ,
- 2. For all Christian chaplains who serve not only the military but also their churches under creedal statements of faith and belief,
- 3. That the implementation of this legislation will be just and righteous,
- 4. That the heretofore moral standards of our military will not be severely denigrated by those of good moral character leaving this godly calling,
- 5. That the Committee and Commission will have wisdom in order to protect those who serve. Praise God that the Commission has adopted additional protections for our chaplains. Please pray that God will grant a powerful and sustained protection for our chaplains from this revision.
- 6. That our military, which has taken an oath defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies foreign and domestic, will not be diminished or perish,
- 7. That this trial will not also in time descend on the pulpits of our land.
