

# CONFESSING OUR FAITH

## westminster larger catechism

### Q 195. What do we pray for in the sixth petition?

**A** In the sixth petition, (which is, *And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil*,<sup>1</sup>) acknowledging, that the most wise, righteous, and gracious God, for divers holy and just ends, may so order things, that we may be assaulted, foiled, and for a time led captive by temptations;<sup>2</sup> that Satan,<sup>3</sup> the world,<sup>4</sup> and the flesh, are ready powerfully to draw us aside, and ensnare us;<sup>5</sup> and that we, even after the pardon of our sins, by reason of our corruption,<sup>6</sup> weakness, and want of watchfulness,<sup>7</sup> are not only subject to be tempted, and forward to expose ourselves unto temptations,<sup>8</sup> but also of ourselves unable and unwilling to resist them, to recover out of them, and to improve them;<sup>9</sup> and worthy to be left under the power of them:<sup>10</sup> we pray, that God would so overrule the world and all in it,<sup>11</sup> subdue the flesh,<sup>12</sup> and restrain Satan,<sup>13</sup> order all things,<sup>14</sup> bestow and bless all means of grace,<sup>15</sup> and quicken us to watchfulness in the use of them, that we and all his people may by his providence be kept from being tempted to sin;<sup>16</sup> or, if tempted, that by his Spirit we may be powerfully supported and enabled to stand in the hour of temptation;<sup>17</sup> or when fallen, raised again and recovered out of it,<sup>18</sup> and have a sanctified use and improvement thereof:<sup>19</sup> that our sanctification and salvation may be perfected,<sup>20</sup> Satan trodden under our feet,<sup>21</sup> and we fully freed from sin, temptation, and all evil, forever.<sup>22</sup>

### Q 195. What do we pray for in the sixth petition?
